25th ASEAN FLAG Meeting In Kunming

The ASEAN Federation of Land Surveying & Geomatics (ASEAN FLAG) held its 25th Council Meeting on 10 April 2006 in the 'spring city' of Kunming. It was keenly hosted by the Yunnan Association for Surveying & Mapping (YASM).

Some 50 delegates from Brunei, Cambodia, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore and Yunnan attended the meeting. Representatives from Singapore included Mr See Seng Guan, Mr Tan Choo Haw, Mr Tang Tuck Kim & Mr Wee Soon Kiang.

The 2-day program included an exhibition of a wide range of land survey equipment designed and manufactured in Yunnan, a visit to the Kunming Metallurgy College which runs a graduate course in land surveying and a discussion with the Governor of Yunnan Province. YASM also made sure the delegates had the opportunity to relax

with a visit to the Stone Forest and even to the Yunnan Tea Research Institute to learn more about the famous PU'ER tea.

In an enthusiastic conclusion to the excellently-organised meeting, YASM offered to host the 11th South East Asian Survey (SEAS) Congress which is scheduled to be held in 2011. ASEAN FLAG welcomed the wonderful gesture and joined YASM to invite all land surveyors to gather in Kunming in 2011.

Ensure Value for Project Stakeholders

The forum was discussed at the 1st ICEC & IPMA Joint Global Congress in the capital of Slovenia – Ljubljana, April 2006. ICEC represented at least 44 countries under 4 Regions – America, Europe, Africa & Eastern coast of Pacific. Many approaches on Value Management were reviewed, and Gurus were invited to share in-depth knowledge on how stakeholders of the project (both external customers and internal stakeholders) could impart their Corporate Management values (corporate plans & strategies) over the Project Management team (responsible for delivering the product in return).

INTERNATIONAL COST ENGINEERING COUNC

These values include Corporate Mission Strategic Plans, Balanced Score Card (project delivery process vs customer satisfaction, financial sustainability vs employees' knowledge growth.), Analysis on Risk and Earned Value on ventured Capital.

Expected competency on Project Management and success factors were analyzed, which among them include the emotional quotient soft skill. In the aspect of Quantity Surveying and Cost Engineering, the need to speed up the processes through automation and the importance of gathering quality Cost Data were emphasized. Also the traumatic iceberg effect on estimating IT software project before requirements known was shared.

The CD Rom of the proceedings is available in SISV Library.

SISV delegates at the Congress were Mr Goh Ngan Hong, Mr Seah Kwee Yong and Ms Iris Teng. They had also during the ICEC world board meeting (held once every 2 years) bid for Singapore to host the 2010 World Congress. This bidding was the second reading and provisional approval has been granted. The final confirmation would be resoluted in the 2008 ICEC world congress to be held in Toronto when Ms Ginette Basak of Region I: Canada would be the Chairperson of ICEC.

Two of the SISV delegates also shared their papers with the congress. Mr Seah spoke on "Impact of Corporate Governance on Project Management" while Mr Goh shared his research findings on "Construction Project Risk Identification".

The delegates were also pleased to hear an announcement at the farewell dinner that one of the "ICEC Distinguished International Fellow" Awards for the year went to Mr Edward Tang of SISV. Mr Goh received the award on his behalf.





14thAVACongress hosted by Singapore after 14 years







A landmark event for Singapore's Valuation fraternity as the last Congress was held here more than a decade ago

Held on local shores back in 1983 and 1992, the 14th ASEAN Valuers Congress went over a century and return to Singapore when it was held at the Meritus Mandarin from 3 - 5 July 2006, attended by over 200 guests and delegates from ASEAN member countries.

Prior to the Opening, the Guest-of-Honour, Mrs Lim Hwee Hua, Minister of State for Finance and Transport was received by the Asean Valuation Association President Dr Lim Lan Yuan and AVA Acting Secretary General Mr MA Muttaqin. She was introduced to the Chief Delegates as well as Ambassadors from member countries.

The Opening Ceremony was a grand affair where the Ambassadors, Embassy representatives, delegates and guests were regaled with a procession of flag bearers together with the Chief Delegates from each member country entering the ballroom with the Guest-of-Honour and Singapore being the host country going up to the stage.

In his welcome address, Dr Lim Lan Yuan reiterated the Association's goal to put forward the interests of valuers and the profession as a whole, while Mrs Lim Hwee Hua spoke on the theme of this event "Valuation in Asia" and the region's economic boom. She then declared the Congress opened.

After this, Chief Delegates from member countries gave a Country Report of their respective real estate market situation. In the afternoon whilst delegates were hosted with networking lunch, the AVA Council members had a lunchcum-meeting. Some of the issues raised at that meeting are: (i) amendment to the Constitution to change all financial matters to be taken charge by Treasurer instead of AVA Secretary General; (ii) venue for the Pre-Congress meeting being confirmed to be held in Brunei 2007; (iii) Indonesia would be hosting the 15th AVA Congress; (iv) Singapore be the AVA Permanent Secretariat and Dr Lim Lan Yuan appointed the Secretary General for 4 years from 2006.









Besides seven plenary sessions over the three days, participants were also treated to a technical visit to either Sentosa or JTC Corporation on the second day. Over 100 participants opted for "Singapore's Island Resort" and were cued in on the leisure resort's recent investments. Others preferred to have a feel of the JTC Corporation's involvement in building a unique local new town in One-North.

And of course, networking is another raison d'être for such conventions; the welcome cocktail, lunches and teabreaks all saw delegates and participants from various countries touch base with one another and exchanges of each other's experiences.

The closing ceremony on Day 3 provided an elaborate finale to the congress. After the final session, tokens of appreciations were presented to country representatives. In his closing speech, Dr Lim encouraged other members to develop their own real estate profession by enhancing professional standard and service quality.



And finally, the farewell dinner at Keppel Club saw all delegates and participants coming together and enjoying local and international cuisine amidst entertaining performances.

And those who wanted to learn more about General Valuation or Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) Valuation attended a short post-congress course on 6 July 2006 morning.

Consecutive meetings - WAVO Board Meeting and the Valuation & General Practice (VGP) Annual Conference – at the Novotel Clarke Quay prepare industry for the challenges ahead

The World Association of Valuation Organizations (WAVO) Board Meeting was held on 15 May 2006 with its Chairman Dr Lim Lan Yuan updating members of various issues, one of which is that SISV will be hosting and maintaining the WAVO website. Members were also informed of its 1st Valuation Congress to be held here in November. There was also a certificate presentation ceremony where the President of ANEVAR (Romania) presented certificates to WAVO board members who spoke at the ANEVAR Conference in October 2005 in Romania.

And as if in tandem, the VGP Annual Conference was held the next day at the same location, which saw more than 100 participants cued in on the latest in both the local and overseas property market.

First to take the floor were the panel of foreign speakers: Mr Clyde Eastaugh from the Australian Property Institute, Mr Keith Goodwin from the Appraisal Institute of Canada, Mr Ion Anghel from the National Association of Romania Valuers and Mr Yue Gangxia from the China Appraisal Society.

Each spoke on the challenges and opportunities within the property market in their respective country. Remarked Ms Goh Seow Leng of Colliers International, "I am encouraged to know that the same challenges faced here are also encountered abroad. We can learn from each other."



Next to grace the pulpit was Dr Lim Lan Yuan, President (VGP), SISV whose topic was "Update on Developments in Real Estate Practice", specifically, on Valuation & Finance, Agency & Marketing, Property Management and Practice Development.

The Sentosa Leisure Group, represented by Mr Gurjit Singh, Director Property and Mr Daniel Wong, Property Manager, were clearly in the business of 'fun' with their lively presentation of the "three PMs": Place Making, Place Management & Project Management. Citing Sentosa as a case study, they showed how proper application of the PMs, allow business and construction works to take place concurrently.

Said Miss Ong Poh Suan of Pasir Ris – Puggol Town Council, "It was an eye-opener to see how they divided the island into various precincts for the various market segments."

Next, Mr Tay Kah Poh Senior Vice President (Research & Strategic Planning) of Pacific Star Asset Management Pte Ltd spoke on the "Real Estate Investment Trust (REIT) & the Valuer", touching on the its growth and its evolution, the local REIT framework and others.

After the morning of information fodder, it was food for hungry stomachs as all broke for lunch, after which Ms Sherene Sng, Director (Retail) of Knight Frank Pte Ltd spoke on Shopping Centre Patronage and the changing face of the retail sector.

Ms Chee Hok Yean Executive Vice President of Jones Lang Lasalle Hotels Corporate Advisory Services, touched on the development of REITS specifically in Asia, the prospects of Hotel REITS in Asia and its future outlook; there is growing popularity of REITS as a divestment instrument as companies go asset light.

Finally, the conference was wrapped up by Ms R Ambika and Mr Harry Goh of Alexander Forbes giving their insights on Professional Indemnity Insurance, focusing on the Salient Aspects of Professional Indemnity Insurance.

After a Q&A session, the participants went back more equipped for the challenges facing the real estate profession.





Sensing the Past, Present and Future

Landsat. SPOT. IRS. These were just some of the Remote Sensing Programs discussed at the Land Surveying Seminar and Feedback on Continuing Professional Development.

It was an expectant crowd that greeted Mr Kwoh Leong Keong when he begun his speech on Civilian Remote Sensing at the SISV office conference room on 8 July 2006. The Director of the Centre for Remote Imaging, Sensing and Processing, National University of Singapore, Mr Kwoh is a subject matter expert, whose renown and extensive experience packed the room to maximum capacity.

The audience comprised chiefly of surveyors who were seeking to upgrade their professional competence by keeping in touch with the latest technological developments in their field of work. Mr Andrew Yap, a registered surveyor who has just returned from furthering his studies overseas, quipped that part of the allure of the event is the opportunity to meet and interact with fellow professional surveyors, thus expanding one's network and providing a forum to discuss issues close to their hearts.



Some diversity was provided with a scattering of architects within the audience. For them, the presentation was good exposure to a field that is separate and distinct from their own, yet closely related at the same time.

Mr Kwoh began his presentation with an introduction to the history of the satellites, and built up to a discussion of their capabilities, specifications and benefits. An issue that provoked healthy debate amongst members of the audience was the freeware – googleearth, and the implications of its introduction.

After the tea break, Mr Kwok moved on to the Mapping Applications of Satellite Imagery. He covered some of the more technical calculations used in photo geometry and wrapped up his presentation by unveiling a video clip of a 3-D rendering of Singapore's waterfront and commercial district using satellite mapping technology. This latter generated quite a bit of excitement in the audience who were curious about the software it used. A participant even remarked that it even had the potential to be used in video games.

Harnessing GPS Technology in Land and Marine Surveying

From 1 Sept 2006, surveyors will be able to apply Global Positioning System technology in their field of work, if they have not been already doing so.

A joint seminar by SISV, the Land Surveyors Board (LSB) and the Singapore Land Authority (SLA) on "GPS Infrastructure and Applications in Singapore" held on 29 July 2006 at Furama City Centre allowed 130 participants insights into the island wide Global Positioning Satellite (GPS) network and of the SiReNT system.

In his opening address, Mr See Seng Guan, President, Land Surveying, SISV explained that SiReNT - Singapore Satellite Positioning Reference Network - was developed by the SLA at a cost of about \$1 million and took about a year to put together. Mr Victor Khoo, SLA Survey Services Manager, foresees considerable cost savings from the new system, while Mr Leong Kin Weng, Vice President of Land Survey at Surbana International Consultants Pte Ltd emphasised that this meant it would benefit customers in the long run.


Mr Parry Oei, Maritime Port Authority of Singapore Chief Hydrographer, Mr Ken Yap, Dinkum Technology Pte Ltd Business Development Executive (Communications) and Ms Loh Sook Yee, Principal Executive of Survey Services also spoke on their respective areas of expertise.



Participants were also treated to an exhibition of the latest in land and maritime surveying equipment by vendors like GPSLands, Sokkia, DKSH and Hydronav. GPSLands even conducted a live equipment demonstration for the participants.

Participant Mr Peh Cheng Kiat from Sembcorp Design & Construction Pte Ltd, said he learnt about the "latest technology for surveying" and said the program was worth considering.

Guests also seemed keen to take up the technology, as seen by flurry of activity during the Q&A session about how the technology could be applied to their specific needs.Questions were also raised about the compatibility of the SiReNT system with different brands of GPS receivers.

An 8-member delegation from Yunnan Association for Science and Technology (YAST) visited SISV on 29 August 2006.



joined by the MPA staff who briefed on the various aspects of hydrographic surveys - horizontal positioning using Differential Global Positioning System (DGPS), equipment that measured speed, roll & pitch and velocity, survey datum to be used, the field acquisition of hydrographic data using a multi-beam transducer, calibration of survey equipment and corrections to be done before the final product can be obtained. A sample of the survey output (a digital terrain model of the seabed) can be seen in Figure 3.

The day ended with the presentation of a memento from LS Division President, Mr See Seng Guan to Mr Parry Oei. Without a doubt, the participants departed with a better understanding of how different hydrographic surveying is as compared to those done on land.
