Previously, Jim was the Design for Value Global Lead for Whirlpool Corporation where he developed a global Value Engineering and Design for Manufacturing and Assembly process within that corporation which was embedded into their Product Development Process globally. He has conducted numerous Module I Workshops globally where he was the advisor and mentor for over 300 certified AVS practitioners and where he developed a professional team of Regional Value Managers in every region where Whirlpool conducts business. Jim was elected as President of SAVE International® in June 2013 after completing several previous 2-year assignments as Executive Vice President, Vice President of Global Affairs, and Vice President of Manufacturing for SAVE International.
